24/15. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

No apologies received.

25/15. DECLARATION OF INTERESTS

Councillor Newton declared a disclosable pecuniary interest in item 28/15, abstained from voting and left the room whilst voting took place. Councillor Spall declared a non pecuniary interest in item 26/15 as owner of a neighbouring property. Councillor Stock declared a non pecuniary interest in item 26/15 as a District Councillor who may be asked to make a determination on this item in that capacity.

26/15. PLANNING APPLICATION – THE LANTERNS, SHOP ROAD, LITTLE BROMLEY.

The Applicant and Objectors were given an opportunity to state their respective case and answer questions by Councillors. Councillor Knott moved to support the application for change of use from agricultural to garden use and object to the retention of the aviary. Reasons for objection were the detrimental affect on the open landscape and that it would set a precedent for other structures to be built.
