38/1. Apologies for absence

38/4. Public Participation - Matters arising from members of the public

Member of the public stated that they witnessed an Extra-Large container lorry cutting through the village. Cllr Smith stated that without video evidence of them entering at Lawford & leaving onto the A120, he is unable to report the matter to Trading Standards.

Member of the public raised concerns regarding business operating without the proper consent within the village. Cllr Stock to make enquiries, and pass onto Corporate enforcement if necessary

38/9. War Memorial

proposed posts being erected on the memorial site, to prevent vehicles from damaging the gardens surrounding the memorial.

Cllr Stock moved that the Council authorised the works to be carried out, up to a value of £250 for materials. 2nd Cllr Smith

Cllr Stock also thanked Ken Hatch for the amount of work put in, looking after the memorial on behalf of the village.

38.10. Paynes Lane entrance – Erosion

Member of the public reported that the Triangle is eroding due to farm traffic using the lane. Clerk to include in email to highways.

38/11. Village Planters

Roly Knott reported that some bulbs have gone missing from the planters. And that some Planters may be in the wrong position. Cllr Stock moved that the council give permission for Roly Knot & Ken Hatch to position and manage the planters throughout the village as they see fit. 2nd Cllr Spall.

38/12. Little Bromley 10K Run

Cllr Stock congratulated Roly Knott on organising yet another successful event, which has now been recognised as a major event in Tendring. Also a lot of local people participated by helping on the day, brought a communal feel.

Mr Knott stated that this was the 3rd Run he organised, and intended to retire after 5 years, therefore some else would have to be found to take over for the future. He would like to see the run continue.

38/13. Tendring Road Rally

Cllr Stock reported that for the first ever closed rally in the UK held within the Tendring area, the Safety Advisory Committee reported that there were no incidents, and limited damage along the route. Video of the route, was taken before and after the race to establish if any areas needed repair.

Clerk reported that Tony Clements is to attend the next Parish Council meeting.

38/14. Neighbourhood Watch

Member of the public, requested that Little Bromley become a Neighbour Watch area. Clerk suggested that a notice be place in the Bromley messenger, asking if anyone would like to take on board. Cllr Stock Proposed, 2nd By Cllr Spall.

38/15. Little Bromley Litter Pick

Reported 20 bags of rubbish collected.

Previously the Amenities Group used to organise the litter pick, and recently done so under the council insurance. Due to the recent closure of the organisation, it was suggested that an organiser be appointed, to officially inform the council of litter pick date, for the council to agree covering. (suggested – Ken Hatch) Also suggested refreshments be provided by the Council. To be put on September's agenda as next litter pick mid-October.
