## 45/3. Operators License Applications

Mullys Farm - Datum have applied for an operators license, to operate a HGV Vehicle and trailer out of Mullys Farm

Cllr Buxton contacted the licensing authority (VOSA) to establish what representation could be made. There are 2 types of representation — The representator who is adjacent to the property, and has to show that they are directly affected by the application. The other is a Statutory Objector who is either a governing body ie the Police, Highways or Local Council (not a Parish Council) who have to demonstrate that reasons that affect highways / environmental and a view on the fitness of the applying company. Close date for this is the 20<sup>th</sup> June 2019. After the licence has been granted, any individual/Company/Governing body can make a complaint to VOSA, and they will investigate the complaint, making a scheduled visit.

Cllr Buxton stated that there has been a tremendous negative feedback from the village parishioners regarding the application, and also the recent Planning application, and therefore has called this Extra Ordinary meeting to discuss the application.

### 45/4. Public Participation

Various members of the public made reference to noise / air pollution from the running of the lorries into the farm. Complained of drivers leaving the engines running and revving the vehicles. The surrounding verges through the village are being ruined, and they are using the War Memorial point as a turning point, with constant damage to the plants and stone. They are also operating outside of the specified

operating hours especially on a Saturday. There is a high risk of accident to road users and pedestrians (dog walkers) as there is no pathway along the road. Parking on the road when there is no access to the site.

Motion moved for the Chairman to write to TDC asking for them to be a Statutory Objector. Proposed Cllr Smith, 2<sup>nd</sup> Cllr Spall – unanimously agreed.
